Like Dillard's with Lake Butler prices

Growing up in a house where Lake Butler's McDonald's is now, Daphne Phillips watched her mother sell ladies' apparel from a dress shop in the family living room.

She said that her upbringing helped to motivate her to open her own women's store, Southern Goddess, at 40 East Main Street, near the corner of Lake and Main.

"So, I was like, when my kids get older and the grandkids are older, I'm going to open this store," Phillips recalled of her first thoughts of going into business. "Then I came up with Southern Goddess because we're in the South, and my name's Daphne, my younger sister's Diana. So, I was like, those are goddess names. So, Southern Goddess."

"I'm the manager and the buyer," Phillips declared. "I go to all the apparel markets. Just went down to Miami in January. They have a big one in Atlanta. We went out to Vegas last August, and I got to see the merchandise and talk to the vendors, just to make sure it's good quality."

Phillips said maintaining quality helps her stay ahead of her primary competitors: Temu and Shien, two China-based e-commerce retailers.

"All that stuff is cheap," she said of the e-commerce competition. "It's just knockoffs. With us, you walk in, you see the quality. You try it on."

"I had somebody that walked in here and said, 'This looks like Dillard's but with Lake Butler prices,'" Phillips recalled of one customer. "I was like, I like that. That's what I was going for."

Popular footwear at Southern Goddess includes Corkys tennis shoes and a HEYDUDE look-a-like called Kayaks. She said the Kayaks are popular with the women who work at the Union County Health Department and with nurses because of their comfort, and the shoes go with a wide variety of colored scrubs.

"The ladies tell me they like the ones with the shiny bling," she said of the glitter-covered footwear. "Yeah, that's what helps me. They come in, and they give me ideas and suggestions, and I shop for the store."

Phillips said that keeping in touch with her clientele and offering to help women put together outfits sets her apart from the internet retailers.

"Top, shorts, shoes, and jewelry," she said. "Just put it all together in one stop."

Phillips said she features an outfit of the day and displays the ensemble on a mannequin in her store's front window. Many times, a customer will try the outfit of the day on and walk out with a new look.

Another popular line is Judy Blue Boutique brand shorts.

"They're on TikTok," she said of the shorts. "If you see something on TikTok, it sells."

Events are another feature of her marketing efforts with a Mother's Day sale, sip-and-shop events featuring a charcuterie board and refreshments, and other holiday specials.

"We do teacher appreciation and nurse appreciation," she said, plus we normally do 10% off to all healthcare workers, first responders, corrections, and military every day. If it's not a sale item, they get 10% off."

Phillips also has a Tiger Table featuring Union County High School gear for women: visors, t-shirts, shoes, and other items.

"We're doing baseball right now, and they actually have a game tonight," she said. "They're winning. They're in the championship. So, I get the

baseball moms and the football moms coming and telling me they need something to wear while they're out there at the ball field. Like these visors, it's so hot out there with the sun on their faces and stuff. Purple and gold, and they like the bling shoes."

With high school graduation approaching, Phillips said she can anticipate what girls will be looking for.

"The white dress," she said, pointing to her left. "The girls wear that underneath their caps and gowns."

Phillips said her customer base includes healthcare workers, teachers, and courthouse employees. But mostly, her customers are her friends.

ORDINANCE 2024-04 AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE LEVY OF AN AD VALOREM TAX NOT TO EXCEED ONE HALF (½) MILL TO BE USED FOR THE FUNDING OF THE UNION COUNTY SPECIAL LIBRARY DISTRICT WHEREAS, the board of County Commissioners of Union County, Florida has created a Union County Special Library District by Ordinance 88-3, and WHEREAS, it is necessary to fund the Union County Special Library District by levy of up to and not exceeding one half (½) mill of ad valorem taxes; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Union County, Florida, as follows:

SECTION 1, FUNDING A. The Board of County Commissioners herein directs the Union County Supervisor of Elections to place upon the First Primary Election Ballot, to be held August 20, 2024, the following: For the continued funding of the Union County Special Library District by taxation of up to (½) mill of ad valorem taxes.

Against the continued funding of the Union County Special Library District of taxation of up to one half (½) mill ad valorem taxes.

B. The Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners is hereby directed to forward a certified true copy of this Ordinance to the Union County Supervisor of Elections upon its final adoption.

C. If the majority of the qualified electors voting in the referendum election, called for and provided in Section 2(A) above, vote in favor of the funding of Union County Special District, then, in that event, the funding of the Union County Special Library District for fiscal years October 1, 2025 through September 30, 2027, will be taxation of up to (½) mill of ad valorem taxes, and all property subject to assessment of ad valorem taxes shall be taxed accordingly.

D. If the majority of qualified electors voting in the referendum election, provided for in Section 2 (A) above, vote against the funding of the Union County Special Library District, then, in that event, this Ordinance shall be automatically repealed.

SECTION 2, DISPOSITION OF PROCEEDS

Those funds obtained from the levy of the ad valorem taxes on all real and tangible, taxable property within the boundaries of Union County Special Library District, shall be used solely for the purpose of construction, operating and maintaining the Library facilities to the citizens of Union County, Florida and for no other purpose.

SECTION 3, COLLECTION OF AD VALOREM TAXES FOR THE UNION COUNTY SPECIAL LIBRARY DISTRICT

The herein provided for the ad valorem tax shall be levied and collected in the manner provided for the levy and collection of the County ad valorem taxes. The Union County Board of Commissioners shall certify annually to the Property Appraiser of Union County, Florida the millage to be levied for the Union County Special Library District. Taxes collected shall be remitted by the Union County Tax Collector to the Clerk of the Court in and for Union County, Florida who shall be the Ex-Officio Clerk and Treasurer for the Union County Special Library District.

SECTION 4, REIMBURSEMENT FOR FUNDS FOR ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANCE BY COUNTY OFFICERS

All cost and expenses incurred by a Constitutional Officer of Union County, Florida in performing any of the provisions of this ordinance may be reimbursed by the Union County Special Library District to said Constitutional Officer; said reimbursements however, shall not collectively exceed ten percent (10) of the revenues collected within the Union County Special Library District in any budget year.

SECTION 5, CONSTRUCTION

This Ordinance shall be liberally construed in order to effectuate the legislative intent of the Board of County Commissioners, Union County, Florida.

SECTION 6, SEVERABILITY

It is declared to be the intent of the Board of County Commissioners,

Union County, Florida, that if any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or provision of the Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional such invalidity unconstitutional shall not be construed as to render invalid or unconstitutional the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7, EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall become effective by law.




"I'm ready to get cooking," said Broome.

Charges dropped in Walmart bomb threat

The State Attorney's Office has dropped charges against a Graham man accused of making a bomb threat at Starke's Walmart last year.

On November 27, Starke police arrested 84-year-old Robert Lee Cain.

According to an arrest report, Cain saw a Walmart associate in one of the retailer's aisles around noon and commented on how crowded the store seemed.

"It always is," replied the store employee, according to the report. "The male subject then continued, 'If a bomb went off right now, all the associates would die.'"

The employee then relayed the exchange to the store manager, who called 911.

Police cleared the store after a dog from the Alachua County Sheriff's Office Explosive Ordinance Disposal Unit checked the building for explosives.

Officers found Cain at his home later that day and arrested him.

In March, prosecutors filed a case action report indicating they would not pursue charges against the defendant.

Cain's attorney, Dan Sikes, said his client was misunderstood.

"Robert Cain is an elderly gentleman, and he means well, but he makes statements sometimes that can be easily misunderstood," Sikes said. "I don't believe for one minute that Robert Cain was ever a threat to anybody in any way, shape, or form. I don't believe it."

18 months for high-speed chase and crash

An 18-year-old Lake City man was sentenced to 18 months in prison after he pleaded to fleeing from deputies and leaving the scene after crashing his car at Starke's Winn Dixie.

Yandel Santana pleaded to felony fleeing and eluding and leaving the scene of a crash without serious bodily injury.

According to a complaint, Bradford Deputy Sheriff Trinton Lovell saw a vehicle traveling 72 mph in a 45-mph zone northbound through Lawtey around 4:35 a.m. on November 23, 2023.

Lovell reported that he made a U-turn to conduct a traffic stop, and the vehicle also made a U-turn into the southbound lanes, leaving the city at approximately 120 mph and reaching a top speed of 138.

The deputy pursued the vehicle onto the Starke bypass while the driver of the fleeing car turned off the vehicle's lights and threw objects out to hinder the officer's pursuit.

Lovell added that he stopped chasing the car after it exited the expressway and headed toward Starke on State Road 100 because of safety concerns.

The deputy wrote that while driving to the sheriff's office to complete his report, he saw the fleeing vehicle crashed at Starke's Winn Dixie.

Lying in the parking lot was the rear-seat passenger with a deep laceration above her right knee. Both the driver, identified as Santana, and the front passenger had fled.

Deputies later arrested the defendant. The charges he pleaded to carry a maximum consecutive sentence of 20 years.

However, he had no previous convictions.

In a letter to the court, an attorney from Apopka wrote that the defendant had volunteered over the last four years in a softball tournament fundraiser for a nonprofit founded to prevent children from drowning.

"Over the last four years," wrote Chrislie Lopez, "Yandel has proven to be a reliable volunteer, always eager to help and with a positive attitude. Even after he moved from the Orlando area, he would still drive the 3 hours from Lake City to Apopka to attend the softball tournament every year."

Six months in jail for stealing from aunt

A 35-year-old Lawtey woman was sentenced to six months in jail and five years' probation after pleading to making over \$16,000 in unauthorized purchases with her aunt's credit cards.

Brandi Fawn Knight was arrested in March 2023 for exploitation of the elderly and fraudulent use of identification of a victim aged 60 years or older.

According to court papers, the victim and her son called the sheriff's office after discovering purchases on a credit card that the victim had canceled. The pair told deputies that when they called Capital One about the card, the company told them the card had been reopened, and the address for the card had been changed to another address, which matched that of the niece. Knight told deputies she was unaware the card had been canceled and that she only used it with her aunt's permission. Meanwhile, the aunt signed a complaint withdrawal due to not wanting to file criminal charges against Knight.

However, two days later, after finding additional purchases on the card, the victim called deputies back, saying she wanted to press charges.

Deputies subpoenaed Capital One for records on the account and received recorded telephone calls in addition to account statements from the company.

Deputies wrote that in one recorded call, a woman believed to be Knight could be heard canceling the card and then later in the call requesting a replacement card and giving Knight's phone number as the point of contact for the account.

The victim told deputies she allowed Knight and her family to live with her for free in exchange for the niece helping the elderly woman with her finances. This arrangement gave the defendant full access to the victim's financial information.

The victim told deputies Knight made over \$7,000 in fraudulent purchases with the Capital One card and another \$9,000 in fraudulent buys with a USAA credit card owned by the victim.

Repeat battery offender gets 18 months

Second seed Union (15-14) has now lost five in a row to Lafayette (23-2), including twice in the Region 3 title game as well as twice in the District 6 championship game.


